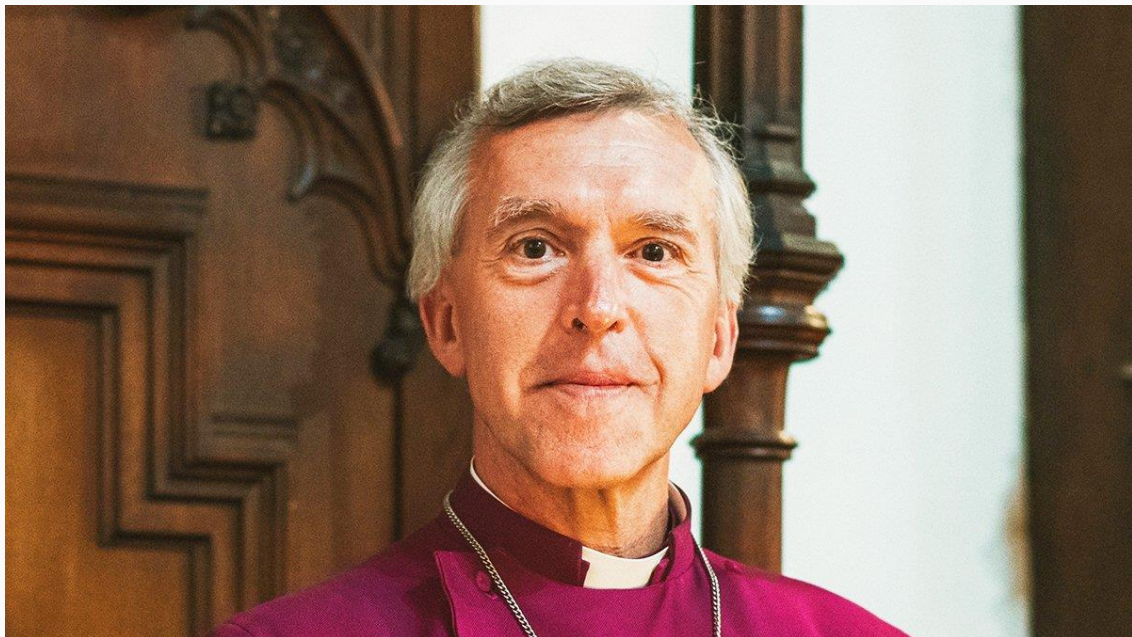

New Archbishop of Wales Elected



A new Archbishop of Wales has been elected.

Andy John who has served as the Bishop of Bangor for the past 13 years, has been chosen as the 14th Archbishop of Wales.

He succeeds Bishop John Davies who retired in May after four years as the leader of the Church in Wales.

Archbishop Andy was elected having secured a two-thirds majority vote from members of the Electoral College on the first day of its meeting at Holy Trinity Church, Llandrindod Wells. The election was immediately confirmed by the five other diocesan bishops and announced at the door of the church by the Provincial Secretary of the Church in Wales, Simon Lloyd. Archbishop Andy will be enthroned at St. Deiniol's Cathedral, Bangor, in due course. As Archbishop he will continue to serve as Bishop of Bangor.

He said, "As we look forward to the future, we face many challenges, but we do so not alone. We face the challenges with God's grace and with one another, because together we are so much stronger, so much better. I am confident that the Church in Wales will be able to respond with energy and vision and vigour. It is my enormous privilege to serve our church to this end."

The Archdeacon of Meirionnydd, Andrew Jones, welcomed the news on behalf of the Diocese of Bangor.

He said, "On behalf of the Diocese of Bangor, I want to congratulate Bishop Andy on his election as the next Archbishop of Wales. His leadership in the Diocese of Bangor since 2009 has been excellent and very much appreciated. He has steered the diocese through uncharted times and has done it with care, compassion and clarity.

"This is a great privilege for us as a Diocese and he becomes the third Bishop of Bangor to be the Archbishop of Wales in the last century - GO Williams in the late 70s/80s and Charles Green in the 30s. Both left a significant mark on the history of our Church and I am certain that Bishop Andy will equally be an outstanding Archbishop, who will lead our Church strategically, diligently and pastorally.

"As a Diocese we pray for Bishop Andy and his family and that he will be blessed in this new ministry and leadership."



Five Themes and Conference Minutes

The second day of the 2021 Diocesan Conference was dedicated to exploring five themes which will underpin our Diocesan Vision. These themes were set by Bishop Cherry and included: Discipleship, Stewardship, Equality & Diversity, Caring for Creation, and Social Justice. The review of these themes involved feedback from small groups which has since been compiled into a comprehensive report for the Diocesan Standing Committee. The Standing Committee wishes to share this report with the rest of the diocese; along with the Minutes of Conference.

The foundations set in this report will be used as we continue to move forward in shaping our Diocesan Vision in 2022. We would like to thank all members of Conference for their contributions to the exercises and discussions. We would also like to thank all the small group facilitators for their work in leading discussions and recording feedback. Thank you all for your support and engagement. We look forward to sharing more details on the continued development of our vision in the new year!

Finding Our Way - Forty Hours of Continuous Prayer

The parish of SS Julius and Aaron are holding Forty Hours of Continuous Prayer on 12-13 December. The church building is open throughout the Forty Hours, day and night, punctuated by Common Worship as set out in the attached poster. The worship space has prayer stations as well as the central focus on the Eucharistic Presence of Christ.

This year, the theme of 'Finding Our Way' reflects the sevenfold offering of these Forty Hours for (1) our Bishop, (2) our Diocese, (3) this nascent Ministry Area, (4) the formation and consolidation of Ministry Areas, (5) the spiritual life

of every community throughout Wales, (6) the whole Church everywhere and (7) the emergence and rebuilding of households, communities and countries worldwide in the ongoing maelstrom of Covid-19 and other events.

The parish priest, Fr David Matthews says, *'I introduced this practice to the Parish a few years before Covid-19 came and I am convinced that this concentrated time of pure prayer has been a critical part of how God's purposes and grace have unfolded among us year by year.'*

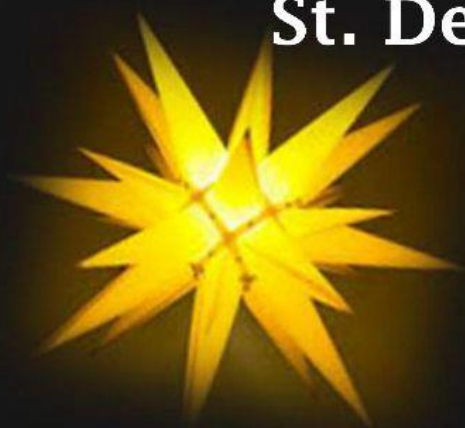

Training for Intercessors



The Lectio for Families app from 24-7 Prayer

Lectio for Families is a free devotional app from 24-7 Prayer that helps families to read the Bible and explore faith through conversation and prayer together.

Lectio For Families is inspired by Lectio Divina: a way of meditating on the Bible that’s been used by Christians for centuries. Like 24-7 Prayer’s free Lectio 365 app (www.24-7prayer.com/lectio365) for individuals, daily content on Lectio for Families follows an easy-to-remember P.R.A.Y format each day: P – Pause, R- Rejoice and Reflect, A- Ask, Y- Yes to God’s ways.

The Lectio for Families app is designed for families with children aged between 7-11 years old, but is likely to be suitable for those who are younger and slightly older too

The app aims to equip families to read the Bible, talk about faith and pray together in an easy way. Content on the Lectio for Families app has been written for families to do together. It includes daily Bible readings and a weekly memory verse, read by children. Each day there are questions to pause and talk about, and creative prompts to pray in new ways.
