

Coronavirus Guidance Update: 17th December 2021

The arrival of the Omicron variant of Covid-19 in Wales is a matter of great concern. Welsh Government has announced new restrictions to come into effect on the 27th December which will make social distancing measures a legal requirement again for certain premises especially shops and offices. We do not yet know whether these will formally apply to places of worship and community buildings and will update this website and guidance as soon as the position is clear.

Ministry Share Q1 2022 & Ministry Share Support Fund

The Diocesan Board of Finance acknowledge that it remains an uncertain time for many and has agreed to continue its financial support to parishes. This includes a rebate for Q1 of 2022 and increased funding for the Ministry Share Support Fund.

Recognising the need for continued support to parishes, the DBF agreed a rebate of 10% for Q1 of 2022 at a recent meeting. This means that the Board will have offered a 40% rebate for three quarters of 2020 and two quarters of 2021 with a further 30% in Q3 of 2021 and 20% in Q4 of 2021 – a full two years of enhanced support.

Until Q2 of 2021 part of this support was received from the Representative Body of the Church in Wales, since then however, the DBF has been funding the enhanced rebate from its own reserves.

Aware of the difficulties and challenges facing our parishes and following

conversations with Ministry Area Leaders and Treasurers, the DBF understand that the pandemic has financially affected some churches and Ministry Areas more than others.

The DBF has therefore agreed to increase the Ministry Share Support fund to £140,000, meaning support can be offered where it is needed most.

Peter Lea, Chair of the Monmouth DBF, encourages those who are most in need to apply saying "throughout the pandemic we have seen the whole Church working together to provide financial support. During these challenging times the DBF are committed to supporting those churches who are most in need. I believe that by working together as a diocesan family we will be able to support one another and emerge from this pandemic with Faith in our Future".

For the first time in history, on June 2nd 2022, as the Beacons are lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man, UK Overseas Territories and in the Capital Cities of the Commonwealth countries in celebration of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, a specially-composed **Song for the Commonwealth** will also be sung by choirs of all sizes and age groups, especially those linked to churches and cathedrals.

On June 2nd 2021, the official **Song for the Commonwealth Competition** was launched, inviting people everywhere to create lyrics and music suited to this historic occasion and moment in The Queen's life on 2nd June next year. We had an amazing response and received many wonderful and meaningful entries from all over the Commonwealth.

The chosen song was announced on December 2nd 2021.

The Lectio for Families app from 24-7 Prayer

Lectio for Families is a free devotional app from 24-7 Prayer that helps families to read the Bible and explore faith through conversation and prayer together.

Lectio For Families is inspired by Lectio Divina: a way of meditating on the Bible that's been used by Christians for centuries. Like 24-7 Prayer's free Lectio 365 app (www.24-7prayer.com/lectio365) for individuals, daily content on Lectio for Families follows an easy-to-remember P.R.A.Y format each day: P – Pause, R- Rejoice and Reflect, A- Ask, Y- Yes to God's ways.

The Lectio for Families app is designed for families with children aged between 7-11 years old, but is likely to be suitable for those who are younger and slightly older too

The app aims to equip families to read the Bible, talk about faith and pray together in an easy way. Content on the Lectio for Families app has been written for families to do together. It includes daily Bible readings and a weekly memory verse, read by children. Each day there are questions to pause and talk about, and creative prompts to pray in new ways.
