#### **Afghan Crisis Toolkit**



Llandaff Diocese have created a toolkit to assist churches in helping Afghan Refugees.

Bishop June says,

"Wales has had a rich history of welcoming migrants and refugees to these shores - from students across the Celtic world attending Llanilltud in the 6th century, to the industrial migrations of the 19th and 20th centuries. The Irish Famine of the 1840s saw Wales welcoming 30,000 Irish migrants fleeing starvation. In Llandaff our industrial valleys have played host to workers from across the world, and Tiger Bay and Butetown transformed Cardiff into one of the most wonderfully multicultural cities on these islands.

Yet in Wales, and across the United Kingdom, we haven't always got it right, we haven't always given the welcome those arriving at our shores have deserved.

And now, as thousands of families who have worked with and supported British

and Welsh troops, diplomats, and civil servants in Afghanistan flee from the Taliban, we as a nation face the challenge of welcoming them and helping them to build new lives in a foreign land."

This month, we are being encouraged to support several campaigns highlighting the importance of defibrillators and the need to learn life-saving CPR.

From 'Shoctober' to World Restart a Heart Day, there are plenty of opportunities for our churches to get involved and help support and raise awareness of these hugely important initiatives.

Rev Gilly Hubbard, team vicar in Caldicot, says: "Back in June, our churches were encouraged to support the Save a life campaign to 'Touch Someone's Life' by watching and displaying a short film which gives clear instruction as to what to do should someone suffer a cardiac arrest – as we, the general public, are the people most likely to be called upon to perform life-saving CPR. This is a Welsh Government initiative, supported by the Church in Wales and numerous other organisations and charities. including Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust (WAST).

"Hopefully, by now this film has been watched in some churches and been integrated on some church websites. However, if this has passed your church by, please consider making it a priority in the weeks to come, especially during the month of October so we can support the work of WAST and Save a Life Cymru."

'Shoctober' may sound like a Halloween event but is actually a Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust (WAST) annual campaign held throughout October which aims to teach Junior pupils (Primary schools) appropriate use of 999 and life savings skills; recovery position, CPR, choking and raise awareness of defibrillators.

October also marks National Restart a Heart Day. Held on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> October, this special day helps to create awareness about the importance of learning CPR and using defibrillators to help save lives.

Revd Gilly, says: "The Save a Life Cymru campaign seeks to promote the placing of AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) outside halls, community centres, churches, businesses and other public places and for the general public to know where they are situated.

"Do you know where your nearest AED is? Is it within 500 meters? 500 metres is a long way to run in an emergency...Maybe your church could support a local organisation to fund-raise for an AED, or run a CPR training morning?

"God has given us the wonderful gift of life- sometimes we are called upon to save a life in more ways than one!"


