Following our programme of meetings, conversations are now being had in all our Ministry Areas about how the ministry area structure can work best in each local context and how it can best support the work of the local churches. We are aware that there are outstanding questions in many areas and a desire for further debate and discussion. However, these discussions will now happen at a local level where you will be supported by your Archdeacon to explore how Ministry Areas will work best in your local context.

Many areas have now formed their transition teams and we would like to thank all those who have volunteered to be on those teams. We look forward to hearing more stories from those teams in the Friday Round-up during the coming months.

To quote from the Mid Torfaen video, Jim Thompson explained that "Ministry Areas are challenging but the positive outweighs the negative. If we really want to be living disciples of Christ then we need to embrace change, we need to embrace Ministry Areas. But remember, by embracing Ministry Areas, we don't lose the individual identity of our churches or ourselves."


Lent Appeal
