None of us are safe until all of us are safe.

Many of you reading this will have had your first vaccine. Some may even have had their second. This is a cause for great rejoicing, not to mention relief. It has been nothing short of amazing to see the speed at which the vaccines have been rolled out in Wales and across the UK. However, the reality is that richer countries like ours are getting more access to vaccines, while the poorer countries are struggling to get supplies. Some have not even been able to start vaccinating yet.

We in Wales may be starting to feel safer now. But, as travel restrictions ease and international travel becomes possible again, the risks of the virus or a variant of it spreading again are highly likely, especially if the rate of vaccination in some countries remains low. None of us are safe until all our sisters and brothers across the world are safe.

Christian Aid is inviting people to give a donation in thanksgiving for the gift of their vaccine. The money will go directly towards helping vulnerable communities around the world access soap, water, food and vital health information in the face of the pandemic. It will also support vaccination programmes in communities by providing data on hard-to-reach populations to local health services and by working with trusted community figures to challenge misleading information about the virus and vaccination as well as any stigma faced by those who contract Covid-19. A webinar exploring how churches in the Anglican Communion can act for climate iustice ahead of COP26 through divestment and investment.

The Anglican Church of Southern Africa, the Church of Ireland and the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia have divested from fossil fuels. The Church in Wales and Scottish Episcopal Church are set to debate divestment at Governing Body meetings in the coming months. There have also been calls for the Church of England to accelerate divestment from fossil fuels, following the motion on divestment passed at General Synod in 2018.

Join this interactive webinar to hear from inspiring leaders across the Anglican Communion, who will share their insights about the steps that Churches need to take on divestment and investment ahead of COP26 in Glasgow in November 2021.
