Tribute to Archdeacon Sue Pinnington



The Bishop of
Monmouth has paid
tribute to the
Archdeacon of the
Gwent Valleys who died
suddenly at the
weekend.

The Venerable Sue Pinnington MBE died peacefully at her home. She was 55.

Bishop Cherry Vann described her death as a "great loss" and a "huge shock". She said, "We have lost a pillar of our church family and community. Archdeacon Sue had a real passion for the mission of the church. She was full of energy and was hugely popular, both with those she served and with her fellow clergy. She was an excellent and supportive colleague and will be greatly missed. Her death is a huge shock to us all and a great loss. We commend her to God and our sympathy and prayers go out to her family and loved ones."

Sue Pinnington had served as Archdeacon of the Gwent Valleys since 2018. She was also the Diocesan Director of Mission. She was ordained as a Priest in 1998, having trained at Trevelyan College, Durham, and St Stephen's House Oxford. She served her curacy in Oakham, Peterborough Diocese, and was then appointed Vicar in Cottingley, in Bradford Diocese and, from 2004, an honorary Canon at Bradford Cathedral. In 2008, she was appointed Rector in Houghton Le Spring in Durham where she served for the next 10 years. In 2010 Sue was awarded an MBE for services to the community, pioneering a flagship project to regenerate the centre of Cottingley.

This reflects a deep commitment and desire to share resources to support the life of the wider church.

Confirmations

The Bishop of Monmouth, the Right Reverend Cherry Vann visited an Abergavenny church on Sunday to conduct a confirmation service for three local children.

The children were all pupils at Llantilio Pertholey Church in Wales Primary School but will be moving on to King Henry VIII Comprehensive School in September. They were introduced to the Bishop by the vicar of St Teilo's Church, Llantilio Pertholey, the Rev. Julian Gray. He was assisted during the service by assistant priest, Rev. John Hughes.

The three candidates, Isaac Bailey, Bella Mars and Zac Stafford all spoke eloquently about their reasons for choosing to be confirmed as members of the church, and the Bishop called it the next step on their journey through life. Because of Covid restrictions the children were only allowed to invite five adults each.

The congregation was not allowed to sing but Simon Oram, a former teacher and head of music at the primary school, played four of the school's favourite hymns.

The centre of mission will focus on those on the edge of society and beyond normal church reach and will build new worshipping communities using Church Army's DARE strategy and values.

You will support the Gwent Valleys Centre of Mission in all activities, including building relationships with people with the aim of exploring the Christian faith. You will pioneer activities in areas not usually reached by the church and will support the Lead Evangelist to build up a team of volunteers to help and be present in the community.

Annual Leave: 25 days plus public bank holidays (33 days total).


