The Trussell Trust is inviting all church leaders in Wales to join them for an online breakfast on Tuesday 8th June. The event will open at 8:10am, with the start of the session beginning at 8:30am. As the event will take place online, participants will have to provide their own breakfast. However, there will be the opportunity to mingle with other attendees before and after the main event at virtual ‘tables’.

The breakfast is open to all church leaders, whether their congregations are involved in supporting food banks in our network or whether they are just interested to hear a bit more about our work. Churches from all denominations play a vital role in supporting the food bank network providing volunteers, venues, leadership, and donations. Over the last year, many

churches have stepped up their support to keep food banks operating during the pandemic. With over 140,000 emergency parcels given out by food banks in our network in Wales during 2020-2021, we really want to express our thanks for the crucial support that churches provide.


This virtual event will bring together church leaders to network, pray, and reflect together. Emma Revie, Chief Executive of the Trussell Trust, will share more about the charity's vision and work to build a hunger free future in partnership with churches, charities, and others. There will be a live Q&A with input from local church leaders and food bank teams. World Refugee Day: Churches are invited to commemorate the lost lives of refugees

The Conference of European Churches (CEC) together with the [Churches' Commission for Migrants in Europe \(CCME\)](#) is inviting churches to commemorate the lives of thousands of migrants and refugees, who lost their lives in the Mediterranean, seeking safety on their way to Europe.

CEC and CCME are encouraging churches to hold online commemoration services, prayers or vigils around [World Refugee Day on 20 June 2021](#), in line with the COVID-19 measures.

Srebrenica Memorial Week

Srebrenica Memorial Week will be taking place 4th – 11th July. Communities across the UK will commemorate the 26th anniversary of the genocide, where over 8,000 Bosnian Muslim men and boys lost their lives.

[Remembering Srebrenica](#) is a charity dedicated to creating a safe society for all. They express that the lesson learned from the genocide in Srebrenica is no society is invulnerable to prejudice and intolerance. We must all remain vigilant against these forces, and take positive action to build stronger, more resilient communities. If you would like to commemorate Srebrenica during the memorial week, Remembering Srebrenica offers the following suggestions:

- Holding a virtual Sunday service on either the 4th or 11th of July. Template programmes are available on their website.
- Posting our “Statement of Commemoration” on your website or social media to show your solidarity with the survivors of the Bosnian genocide.
- Lighting a candle in remembrance of the victims of genocide.
- Connecting with other faith groups to organise an interfaith event online or in-person, for reflection or prayers.
