

St John's Knit & Natter Group -Rogerstone Newport Benefice of Bassaleg

We have been knitting crib covers, blankets, hats and teddy bears for the Royal Gwent Hospital, Newport, for their premature and full -term babies.

They are very grateful, as they say, if they run out of hats, which they put on every baby to reduce heat loss, they would have to go out and buy them. They can have up to twelve births a day so that could mean three hundred and sixty babies a month!

We were asked if we could make some Christmas hats, as they dress every baby born at Christmas in a nice babygrow and hat. We looked for some patterns and are now knitting festive hats e.g. Christmas Trees, Santa Hats and Christmas puddings.

The photograph shows our third lot of knitting ready to go to the hospital - hats, crib covers, blankets, cardigans and teddy bears. This was taken at our last meeting before lockdown on the 18th March 2020.

Our needles have been busy during lockdown and we now have another three hundred and fifty hats, six teddy bears and some crib covers ready. This will be our fourth lot of knitting for them. The hospital also wondered if we could make two shawls for for them in readiness for their move to the new Grange Hospital. These will be given to the first baby girl and boy born there. These are being done as this is being written, and we nearly have enough Christmas hats made as well. Although we can't have our meetings for the foreseeable future, we will continue knitting to keep the hospital stocked up with knitted items.


