Young People Are Focus of £3m Evangelism Project



Young people and families are the focus of a landmark £3m project being launched by churches in south-east Wales.

The Diocese of Monmouth has secured funding to create four new church communities over the next five years. Through social action and community engagement, these church plants will seek to bring the transforming love of Christ to their communities, aiming to bring the under 40s into a vibrant faith life.

The funding is from the Church in Wales' Evangelism Fund, set up six years ago for diocesan projects to help people engage with the Christian faith in new and exciting ways.

Announcing the project, the Bishop of Monmouth, Cherry Vann said, "I am immensely grateful to all who have worked so hard to get our Evangelism Bid across the line. The £3m grant will enable us to do some focused work in establishing new worshipping communities, drawing children and families into faith and discipleship.

This has the potential to provide us with a step change in our missional activity and bring new energy and hope to the life of our diocese."

The funding allows the Diocese of Monmouth to embody the diocesan vision (launched in 2022) which placed evangelism at the heart of its mission. Each church plant will be resourced with a leader, and children and families'

pioneer, allowing them to develop organically and without placing burdens on existing clergy. The funding aims to grow these church plants into self-sustaining communities by the end of the five years.

The project is strategically crafted to engage and welcome the under 40s into the fold of a dynamic faith life. Through the establishment of communities in Chepstow and Tredegar, and two more locations in 2026, the project aims to foster a sense of belonging and family within the Church in Wales.

Geraint Davies, Chair of the Evangelism Fund Committee said, "This a well thought out project which will benefit the communities that it will serve. I look forward to continuing to support Bishop Cherry and her team as churches are planted in Tredegar and Chepstow."

Chaplaincy Service

A wonderful service celebrating the work of chaplains was recently held at Newport Cathedral.

Bishop Cherry introduced the service by saying that chaplains often reach people that clergy and licensed lay ministers rarely do.

The service included reflections by Revd. Rufus Noy (mission to seafarers) and Revd. Liz Perry (prison ministry).

There was also a reflection from Community Mission Outreach Worker Nicola Roylance, about her work with the deaf community across Monmouth and Llandaff dioceses.

During her reflection Nicola reminded us: "In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus tells us 'Go and make disciples of all nations.' We have a duty to be reaching all people. Especially people who don't know Jesus. Deaf people are the biggest unreached group of people in the world and today the Diocese is taking a big step forward to change that."



Nicola was formally licensed by Bishop Cherry for the work she does within the deaf community, through the use of sign language.

The service was a reminder of the wonderful work being done which is rarely seen but so important and we were reminded and encouraged to include the work of chaplains in our prayers.

Ministry Share Support Fund

Senior Church Buildings Inspector



The Dioceses of Monmouth and Llandaff are looking to appoint a Senior Church Surveyor to lead a team which will include a Junior/Graduate Surveyor, a DAC Secretary and a Grants and Funding Officer.

This is an excellent opportunity for a dedicated professional to lead a team that will make a real difference to an exceptional group of historic buildings. Across both dioceses there are 380 church buildings. 46 of these are Grade I listed, 83 Grade II*, 114 Grade II and the remainder unlisted.

The successful Senior Building Surveyor's Role

The successful Senior Church Surveyor will be responsible for a broad range of tasks, with a particular emphasis on producing quinquennial condition surveys on church buildings.

A key aspect of the Senior Building Surveyor's responsibilities will be to support local volunteers to use these condition surveys to maintain, repair and develop their church buildings.

- Be a Chartered Building Surveyor, Architect, or similar with significant practical experience in the building industry and the historic environment.
