£12,000 raised so far for Lent Appeal



Bishop Cherry would like to thank everyone for their generosity in raising an amazing £12,000 for this year's Lent Appeal.

The money will be donated to our link diocese in the Highveld, South Africa, and with events still taking place and money still coming in, this total is set to increase even further!

Bishop Cherry, said: "£12,000 is an astonishing amount to have raised, especially in the current financial climate. I am aware that all kinds of events have been put on to help raise funds; events which have brought people together for fun and entertainment as well as supporting the Lent Appeal–Murder Mysteries and African Nights, to name but two. But I would like to thank everyone who has contributed in any way. The money is very much needed out in The Highveld and will be put to good use in helping to alleviate some of the significant and systemic poverty across our link diocese."

Bishop Cherry and others from across the diocese visited the Highveld last November and saw first-hand how desperately funding was needed and how much it could impact on people's lives.

"We are increasingly focusing on being outward looking in mission, and through our buildings, we have an opportunity to extend an invitation for people to come and take a closer look at them whilst also offering something of the story of our faith. We hope that people will be inspired by the history as well as the generations that have worshipped in those buildings before us, but also recognise the opportunity to show how we our telling the Christian story today and. Our buildings are important tools in doing that. I have no doubt that Churches Unlocked will be a success for those taking part from Monmouth Diocese and we look forward to it growing in years to come."


## **Eco Fair update**

# Cathedral appoints new Director of music



Newport Cathedral is delighted to announce the appointment of Thomas Coxhead as the new Cathedral Director of Music. Tom is currently Director of Music at Christ Church, East Sheen in South West London alongside a busy schedule of work as a freelance conductor, organist, and teacher.

He has previously held posts as Assistant Organist at Ripon and Brecon cathedrals, Ampleforth College and also taught at Harrogate Ladies' College.

Commenting on the appointment, the Dean, Very Revd Ian Black said: "I am delighted that Tom has accepted the role of Director of Music. He will build on the tremendous work of Emma Gibbins, taking the choir and music of the Cathedral forward. We are looking forward to welcoming him to Newport."

Tom will take over from the current Director of Music, Emma Gibbins in September and was the unanimous choice of the panel and the clear favourite of the choir after leading rehearsals with them as part of the interview process. He is passionate about the role of music within the liturgy.

Tom said, "I am really looking forward to taking up the position of Director of Music at Newport Cathedral. I greatly enjoyed working with the choir in the audition process and I am excited to lead the music at the Cathedral working alongside my new colleagues. It's clear to me that Emma Gibbins has done so much to buildup the music at Newport and I hope to be able to continue the great work she has achieved."

Tom began his musical career as a chorister at Chester Cathedral and went on to study music at Durham University. He has a Research Master of Arts in Musicology and was recently awarded a Master of Music in Choral Conducting with distinction from the Royal Academy of Music. He has a Licentiate, or professional diploma, from the Royal Academy of Music and is an Associate of the Royal College of Organists.

Tom frequently edits and arranges music, as well as maintaining his academic profile researching twentieth century British composers - particularly Kenneth Leighton. He occasionally composes, and his anthem, written with his sister Elizabeth, 'My eyes for beauty pine', was sung at the Royal Maundy service in 2023 at York Minster.

In his spare time, Tom enjoys hiking and walking, is a keen amateur artist, and likes cooking – particularly enjoying good food with company to match.

Tom will take up the appointment at the beginning of September, at the start of the new choir year.

### New Vicar Announced for Mid-Torfaen



Bishop Cherry is delighted to announce that Rev Martyn Evans will be joining Mid Torfaen Ministry Area as vicar.

Martyn is currently serving as Ministry Area Leader in neighbouring Llandaff Diocese, but was ordained in Monmouth and spent several years in the diocese.

Bishop Cherry said: "It is good to be welcoming Martyn back to the Diocese of Monmouth. I look forward to licensing him and celebrating all that he will bring

to the life of the churches in the Mid-Torfaen Ministry Area and wider diocese."

Martyn is excited to be joining Fr Philip Godsell and the rest of the ministry area team.

He said: "Having served as the Ministry Area Leader of the Llynfi and Upper Afan Valleys over the last few years, I am looking forward to the opportunity to focus more on 'discipleship and spiritual nurture' and 'mission and outreach' in the churches and communities which the ministry area serves.

"I have a passion to move people from being simply 'church attenders' to become 'Lifelong Disciples' and 'Ambassadors for Christ', encouraging people to make connections between their church life and their life outside of the church.

"I am also delighted to be returning home to the Monmouth Diocese where I was ordained in 2012, serving my curacy in Tredegar and later in 2015 as Ministry Area Leader in Lower Islwyn."

Prior to ordination, Martyn was the Finance Director for a division of a medical company, having qualified as a Fellow of the Chartered Certified Accountants. He has never really been able to escape totally from the world of finance, serving on the Diocesan Board of Finance for both the Diocese of Monmouth and Llandaff. He has also been a member of Governing Body.

In his spare time, Martyn enjoys spending time with his black Labrador 'Maisie' and trying to play the piano.

Rev Martyn Evans will be licensed on 4th August.

### **Licensing of Rev Bronwen Summers**



Rev Bronwen Summers was licensed as Pioneer Vicar for Tredegar Park Ministry Area at a ceremony held at St Thomas, Newport at 7pm on 22nd May.

During her sermon Bishop Cherry said "When we recall some of the great pioneers in history, we might think of those who sailed the seas in search of new territories; who crossed deserts, climbed mountains and hacked their way through jungles because they were there to explore. We might equally think of those who broke new ground in science, education and medicine."

"A pioneer vicar, then, is a cleric who is breaking new ground, who goes beyond what we might consider the traditional role of a vicar and reaches out into new spaces and places to share the gospel and draw people, by God's grace, into faith – and into the community of faith."

The Cathedral has a finite capacity so if you are aware of a large number of lay people attending from your churches, we would be very grateful if you could again let Vicki know.


