### **Diocesan Vision - Discipleship**

Over the coming weeks we will be sharing five films which reflect some of the conversations and discussions taking place as we develop our Diocesan Vision together.

The Vision is based on the Five Marks of Mission and the films show clergy and laity from across our diocese discussing the key themes of discipleship, stewardship, environment, equality and diversity, and social justice.

The films reflect how people are already thinking of ways in which these themes can be developed across each of our Ministry Areas.

Introducing the films, Bishop Cherry explains how she hopes that, as plans are developed and ideas are shared, the “enthusiasm to use this vision confidently and to work for spiritual and numerical growth in our churches will become contagious.”

Heart of Monmouthshire is the 8th of our new Ministry Areas to be inaugurated so far this year.

## Newport Cathedral Sponsored Pilgrimage Walk

Newport Cathedral had their sponsored pilgrimage walk raising funds for the Bishop of Monmouth's new Social Responsibility Fund on Saturday (28 May).

Revd Canon Andrew Lightbown said,

"In all nineteen walkers from across the diocese took part in the Sponsored Pilgrimage Walk from Llandaff Cathedral to Newport Cathedral. We were also joined for a seven-mile stretch, along the Welsh Coastal Path, by four very well-behaved dogs. The group walked together, talked together, ate together, and

prayed together, which I guess is the essence of pilgrimage. In total we covered eighteen miles. It was wonderful, from a cathedral perspective, to get to know friends - fellow Christians - from across the diocese. We can't yet give a totally accurate figure for the amount raised. but it will be in the region of £5,000 with this sum including £2,000 from the cathedral congregation and chapter. The walkers were supported by a team of drivers, podiatrists, and refreshment makers. We enjoyed a wonderful tea when we arrived, wearied but elated, at the cathedral and special thanks must go to the team at St. Bride's Wentlooge for the tea, coffee, and very probably the best Welsh Cakes ever baked! This was the first of two sponsored walks the cathedral has arranged. On the 15th of July, the choristers are walking across The Severn Bridge and back, once more for the Social Responsibility Fund. Today, as I left the cathedral after Evening Prayer, I happened to glance at the visitor's book, and the last entry seemed apt. The address given was simply this: Kharkiv."

## Praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' from Ascension to Pentecost.

Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to faith in Jesus Christ.

This year, between Ascension Day and Pentecost (May 26<sup>th</sup> – June 5<sup>th</sup>), Christians from over 172 countries will be praying specifically for three things:

Firstly, that their own faith might be strengthened and deepened.

Secondly that the five people they commit to praying for daily will come to faith.

Thirdly, that the Holy Spirit will empower all of us to be more effective in our witness.

To pray the words 'thy Kingdom come' is to express a desire and a hope for the world to be a better place: a world where lives, relationships and communities are based on the love, justice, freedom and peace that we find through faith in Jesus.

I encourage you to use these 11 days to pray for a renewing of your faith, for an empowering of the Holy Spirit and for five people you know to come to faith in Jesus Christ.





## The Banister Charitable Trust

Capital grants usually between £2,000 and £50,000 are available to UK registered charities that are working in the areas of conservation and the protection and improvement of the UK's physical and natural environment.

Bristol-based family grant-making charity, the Banister Charitable Trust is an environmentally focussed grant-making charity which regularly awards grants exceeding £1 million in total each year.

UK registered charities may apply for a grant for projects that conserve, improve, promote and protect the physical and natural environment in the UK. Grants are normally awarded for capital projects. The Trust is a regular supporter of RSPBs, Wildlife Trusts and River Trusts.

Previous awards have been made for:

- Bird boxes for churches and village halls.
- Education centre gardens and wildlife areas.
- Habitat restoration, and
- Purchasing land.

## The Archbishop of Wales Fund for Children


The Newport Committee of the Archbishop of Wales Fund for Children is holding a Supper Party at Bishopstow on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022, by kind permission of Bishop Cherry. The AWFC provides financial support to a wide range of children's projects, and backed 20 enterprises in 2019 and 14 in 2020. The Newport Committee (Monmouth Diocese) was specifically thanked in the 2019/20 report for raising the largest percentage of the money donated. We note, however, that only **one** project in this diocese was supported in 2019 and a further **one** in 2020. Out of a total of £23,556 allocated in 2019 only £3,000 went to Monmouth, and only £454.20 of £16,669.70.

**ABOUT THE DAY:** The Festival of Prayer Day began in 2016 and until the Pandemic went from strength to strength. The Festival will be held in St Teilo's Church in Wales High School, Circle Way East, Cardiff CF23 9PD. The day begins with the Eucharist and Address at 10am. This will be followed by three sessions throughout the day.

The Llandaff & Monmouth Festival of Prayer provides 'taster' workshops in many different prayer techniques and spiritual traditions, and sessions that go deeper. The breadth of content will be delivered in a gentle pace with lots of renowned Welsh hospitality making the day suitable for beginners and the more experienced alike.

Among the riches on offer are different ways of praying, 'Your Will be Done', 'God's Amazing Plan', 'To Hell's Mouth', 'Does God Love Sport?', 'Icon of Annunciation and Pentecost', 'Music and Faith', 'Julian of Norwich', 'The Compassionate heart', 'Poetry and Prayer', 'What does God need with a Starship? Encountering the Divine in Star Trek', to name but a few.

There are lots of workshops to choose from, each standing alone and lasting an hour, with most offering a time of prayer in the appropriate style except the Islamic one which will not include sharing in prayer.

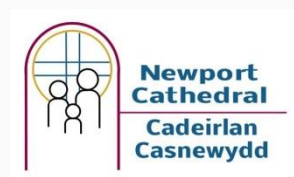
