## **Chrism Mass 2025**



Chrism Mass will take place on the Tuesday of Holy Week, **15th April 2025**, at **11am** in Newport Cathedral. This is an extraordinarily beautiful service at which the sacred oils are blessed – the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil – and ministers of Word and Sacrament, together with the people of God, gather together around the Lord's Table to reaffirm our commitment to the ministries entrusted to us.

We encourage all priests, deacons and licensed lay ministers to attend. There will be an opportunity to renew our vows and promises as we walk with Jesus in this holiest of weeks. You are invited to robe – priests and deacons in alb and white stole, LLMs in cassock, surplice and scarf – and to stay on after the service for a buffet lunch.

Congregation members are also warmly invited to come for the service and for the buffet lunch as the Church of God, once again, recalls the salvation wrought for us in Jesus's self-offering on the cross. This is a moment in Holy Week when each of us can pause and reaffirm our commitment to take up our own cross and follow him.

## **Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme Online Survey**





The Archbishop of Wales urges churches and ministry areas to complete a new survey launched by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

As you may be aware, VAT must usually be paid when you carry out repairs, maintenance and alterations to buildings. However, places of worship that have been 'listed' for their special architectural or historic interest can generally reclaim the VAT paid through The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (<u>https://listed-places-ofworship-grant.dcms.gov.uk/</u>). This scheme has operated since 2001 and is funded by the UK government through DCMS. Following meetings he has held recently, the Archbishop has received an invitation for all churches to support an evaluation of the scheme.

This work has been commissioned from Harlow Consulting, an independent research consultancy. As part of the evaluation work, they are conducting a short online survey to help understand individual places of worship's experience of the scheme. This survey consists of around 25 questions and will play a vital role in enabling DCMS to understand the outcomes and impacts of the scheme. We need as many places of worship as possible to participate, so that we can produce reliable findings.

# Thy Kingdom Come - 9 Days of Prayer and Mission, 29th May -8th June



The need for the transforming power of God in our world and neighbourhoods is more stark than ever. There is a greater hope that we can offer the world. It is our hope and prayer that those who have not heard the Good News of Jesus and his love for the world will hear it for themselves, giving them an opportunity to respond.

This year, our diocese will join people from around the world to dedicate the time between Ascension to Pentecost in 9 days of Prayer and Mission. This is an opportunity to partner with God in prayer and mission so your community can encounter the love of Christ.

We are encouraging your Ministry Area to spend the 9 days from Ascension (**29th May**) to Pentecost (**8th June**) in praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' and in living out the vision of Gods Kingdom on Earth.

Each day you can hold a different prayer or mission activity and over the coming weeks we will be offering different suggestions, and sign post you to resources that you might wish to develop.

Each ministry area will be provided with prayer booklets to support people in praying at home. We will also gift  $\pm 500$  to each ministry area to run an event during these 9 days to which you can invite people to.

There is the opportunity to receive a grant of £500 towards an ongoing outreach activity. Speak to Archdeacon Stella for more information.

Our collective outreach will be celebrated at a Pentecost Service on **Saturday 7th June** in St Marys Abergavenny, where we can gather, with Bishop Cherry, to joyfully worship and pray together as the Diocese family. Teaching and Activities will be put on for the children and youth and the service will be followed by refreshments.

### Some starter ideas:

- Arrange a rota for your church to be open for quiet prayer and reflection and publicise this across your area. Maybe set up some prayer stations with simple instructions to help people to journey in prayer.
- Organise a community litter pick.
- Undertake an eco project in your churchyard or register for Eco Church and spend this week working towards your bronze award.
- Hold a community picnic and invite those you know who are on their own or have been recently widowed.
- Hold an outdoor service to demonstrate that the church is actively praying for its local area and allowing for the spirit to prompt those who are passing to be curious.
- Undertake a prayer walk.
- Plan a partnership project with your local school i.e. visit a nursing home, provide an afternoon tea, draw together the different generations.
- Take up a special collection for the local foodbank.
- Hold an open churches event or family fun day.
- Have a schedule for daily prayer to happen across your churches or for a rosary group to gather each day.



# The Ministry of Fundraising



### In this midweek mailing our Grants and Funding Officer, Calum Glanville-Ellis shares advice on applying for grants - specifically, how to approach writing successful Trust and Foundation applications.

"Father in heaven, you have given us a mind to know you, a will to serve you, and a heart to love you. Be with us today in all that we do, so that your light may shine out in our lives. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."

Applying for grants can feel daunting. Forms can be lengthy, requiring detailed evidence, and so much can rest on securing funding. The best way to approach the process is to start early and stay organised. Here are three key tips to help you prepare:

### 1. Get Your Ducks in a Row

Before you begin writing, gather all the necessary documents required by the funder. These often include:

- Signed accounts for your ministry area
- Two or three quotes from contractors for the work
- Evidence of faculty and planning permissions (if applicable)
- Most grant bodies provide a grant criteria sheet on their website—review this carefully to ensure you meet all requirements.

### 2. Prepare a Strong "Case for Support"

A Case for Support is a one-page summary that outlines:

- What your project is
- Why it's project needed
- The impact it will have

Think of this as your project's pitch. Use clear, inspiring language to help funders connect with your vision. This document can also serve as a foundation for multiple applications, saving you time in the long run.

### 3. Research Your Funders Well

Not all grant funders operate in the same way. Before applying:

- Check their accounts via the Charity Commission to understand their funding patterns.
- Read their website carefully to mirror their language and priorities in your application.
- Pay attention to terminology—some funders may use terms like "deprived areas", while others prefer "underserved communities." Tailoring your wording can strengthen your application.

Another useful tool is a Grant Strategy Table, which helps organise potential funders. I've prepared a template for you, available <u>here</u>—feel free to customize it for your project.

Perhaps you could benefit from attending one of the many training sessions offered by the <u>National Churches Trust</u>. They are all free and cover loads of subjects from fundraising and grants to project management. Click <u>here</u> to find out more.
