New bishops consecrated



Two bishops were consecrated at a special service on Saturday (Feb 26).

The new Bishop of Swansea and Brecon, John Lomas, and the Assistant Bishop in Bangor, Mary Stallard, were consecrated in a service at St Deiniol's Cathedral in Bangor which was live-streamed to allow everyone to join in.

The service was led by the Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, who is also the Bishop of Bangor. The new bishops were led into the Cathedral by a long procession which included representatives from all of the dioceses and cathedrals of Wales. During the service, the new bishops were anointed with holy oil and presented with the symbols of office: a bishop's episcopal ring, a pectoral cross and mitre, as well as a Bible and a pastoral staff.





An address was given by the Archdeacon of Anglesey, Andrew Herrick.

New music, composed for the occasion, was performed for the first time at the service. The choir of Saint Deiniol's Cathedral sang a setting of the Communion texts by Joe Cooper, based on the melodies of well-known Welsh hymns. A special anthem, composed by Simon Ogdon, was sung at a high point in the service, immediately before the two new bishops were ordained.

Archbishop calls for urgent support for Ukraine crisis appeal

The Archbishop of Wales is calling for urgent support for Christian Aid's crisis appeal for Ukraine.

The Christian charity is working with its partners to distribute food and other life-saving essentials to people on the Ukrainian borders fleeing deadly violence. It is also calling for people to add their voices to the change.org petition launched by Together With Refugees member, Freedom From Torture, which calls on the UK Government to provide humanitarian support to the people of Ukraine. So far, an estimated 102 civilians have been killed with a further 406 injured - and the true figures could be far higher. Half a million people have fled the country in recent days, and many more have had to leave their homes to escape the fighting.

The Archbishop, Andrew John, says, "We are all shocked and sickened by Russia's merciless attack on Ukraine. A humanitarian crisis is unfolding rapidly as people flee for their lives and we must respond swiftly to help. I am calling on our churches and communities in Wales to step up and donate generously to Christian Aid's appeal and sign the petition to the UK Government to do more to help refugees.

"We must also continue to pray for Ukraine and for all its people at this terrible time."


Head of Christian Aid Wales, Mari McNeill says, "In light of the devastating events in Ukraine, Christian Aid has launched an appeal to support those fleeing deadly violence. We'll be working with partner organisations in the ACT Alliance to offer rapid humanitarian assistance to the Ukrainian people. So far, two of our ACT partners have distributed 28 tonnes of food supplies and other lifesaving essentials to people on the Ukrainian borders. In this dark and worrying time for the people of Ukraine and for everyone who believes in peace, we can join together to give, act and pray."

Archbishop joins call for rethink on refuge Bill



The Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, is among more than 1,000 faith leaders from across the UK who have written to the Prime Minister urging him to reconsider the Nationality & Borders Bill.

The leaders, representing the six major faith groups in the UK, said they are "horrified and appalled about the potential repercussions" of the Bill and called on the Prime Minister to make urgent changes "even at this late stage".

The letter, published today (Monday 28 February 2022), the day the Bill enters its final stages in the House of Lords - a crucial last opportunity to make changes - states: "While there is still conflict and injustice in the world, there will always be desperate people needing to seek sanctuary from war, persecution and suffering. We cannot close our door on them, but this Bill does just that.

"We assert that the values that bind UK citizens together, especially those concerning human dignity and life, will be fundamentally damaged by this Bill."

In the context of rising global conflict, including this week in Ukraine, the way the bill undermines the UK's ability to support all people fleeing conflict is even more prominent. The letter calls on the Prime Minister to make substantial changes to the Bill. These include abandoning the government's plans to criminalise and restrict the rights of all people arriving in the UK seeking refugee protection outside pre-arranged schemes, including those coming via irregular routes, such as by boats or lorries. The signatories say this policy was made 'without a basis in evidence or morality'.

The signatories also assert that the government must urgently address the failure to establish safe routes through the Bill, which would help people seeking sanctuary reach the UK, saying that this failure fundamentally undermines its aims. They urge the Prime Minister to be 'compassionate and ambitious' in opening schemes such as family reunion, routes for unaccompanied refugee children in Europe and resettlement.

Representatives from communities in every county in England have signed, as have a broad representation in Scotland and Wales. Many faith groups across the UK have witnessed first-hand the positive impact of safe routes on people in their communities, working in refugee integration initiatives, community sponsorship programmes and providing emergency support to refugees recently arrived from Afghanistan.

The letter calls on the Prime Minister to show 'political leadership' and promote 'compassion, human life and dignity'. Faith leaders have asked the Prime Minister to meet to discuss their concerns.

The letter was coordinated by the ecumenical Joint Public Issues Team, made up of the Methodist Church in Britain, Baptist Union of Great Britain and United Reformed Church, working with the Church of Scotland.

Coronavirus Guidance

Update: 2nd March 2022

Our guidance notes have been updated to reflect the latest regulations for Covid-19. It remains a legal requirement to prepare a written risk assessment to control the risk of Covid transmission and the guidance seeks to help local church councils consider what would be appropriate in their circumstances.

In addition to face coverings no longer being required (except in retail, transport or health settings), the QR codes on the Covid-19 app for England and Wales are no longer operational as a means of recording attendance.

The Bench of Bishops has signalled that, subject to local risk assessment, the common cup might be restored from Easter Day. There is no requirement to do so and communion in one kind remains valid. No communicant should feel compelled to take the common cup. Updated guidance for the administration of holy communion has been provided to help you think about how to conduct communion safely and to consider the relative risks of different approaches. You should consider your approach carefully and communicate this to your congregation.
