Woolos Winter Wonderland at Newport Cathedral!



Come and see the smallest Christmas Tree festival in Wales (if not the whole world!) at Newport Cathedral!

Our Posada (from the Spanish word for inn) for Christmas 2024 features a forest full of Christmas trees decorated by local businesses from around the cathedral. It was the idea of Wendy Diamond, Bishop Cherry's partner, who is a gifted potter and artist.

Wendy has enjoyed visiting many Christmas Tree Festivals over the years and wondered how we might fit one into our small cathedral, and so the idea of the Woolos Winter Wonderland was born – a Christmas Tree Festival in miniature.

Ably assisted by members of the Cathedral community Carol Brown, who made the mini-Christmas trees, Fay Howe who painted the mini 'Piper' windows and Sally Lightbown who assisted with all things technical, the Woolos Winter Wonderland began to take shape!

At the centre is a representation of Newport's famous landmark the Transporter Bridge, illuminated by representations of the cathedral's famous John Piper east window. The forest of trees are decorated in all kinds of fun ways representing each business, among them our local launderette, art school, nail bar, dress shop, Vittorio's Italian restaurant, and Tovey Brothers' Funeral Directors who took part as well!



James Tovey, said it was marvellous way of connecting the Cathedral with the wider community. Tovey's tree was a 'family tree' featuring all the Tovey family involved in the firm as well as all their staff. George, Head Waiter at Vittorio's produced a truly amazing tree, rooted in a large empty tin of Italian tomatoes and featuring decorations made of pasta and their colourful menus!

The Posada will be on display until the Feast of the Epiphany and can be viewed daily at the Cathedral. Come and see Mary and Joseph as they journey to Bethlehem on the Woolos Express steam train!

With the recent floods and severe weather, now is a good time to ensure that our churches are well prepared for the winter weather.

Apart from making sure that gutters, downpipes and drains are clear, it's also worth taking a look at boiler rooms if these are located below ground level, checking that roof coverings are watertight and that any slates or tiles that are loose are repaired.

Please don't put yourself at risk when checking the building and if you notice something that needs to be fixed, please get in touch with the property team for more advice or contact one of the contractors on the Approved Contractors List.

Regular maintenance is essential to keep our buildings warm, dry and in good condition as we head into what is likely to be a wet and cold winter.

Burn Like Stars - Online Course



Clergy burnout is something that can affect anyone in ordained ministry. Trying to see the signs before it happens is really important obviously. To help with this the diocese have purchased free access for clergy to an online course which has been put together by Gillian Straine who many of you will have met on our clergy residential.

The course can be taken at your own pace and you can repeat parts that are particularly useful.

Whilst the course is intended for individual use, you may wish to discuss it with a colleague or a small group, but that is your choice. Details are as follows:

Burn Like Stars is a 12 session online self-led course exploring how to avoid or recover from burnout. Go on a journey today to explore how to live and work in healthy and holistic way, grounded in the wisdom of our Christian faith.

To shine like stars is to remain energised and to consistently burn on, when some are burning out.

The course will allow you to:

- Identify the signs of burnout in yourself and others;
- Embed practices to help you heal from, or avoid, burnout;
- Reflect on a Christian response to burnout and find a healthy work-life balance.

You will receive:

- A prayerful and inspiring web based journey through the wisdom of faith and science content that is deeply interconnected with the realities of life;
- Biblical reflections on burnout;
- Anti-burnout practices based on the latest research from science and psychology;
- Bonus GoHealth podcast content;
- Prayers and blessings for yourself and others;
- The ability to return the course whenever you are in need of a refresher!




